

WHERE TRADITION MEETS INNOVATION

Natural light, strong lines, and a timeless material palette set the tone for the 2025 Home & Garden Colorado Showhouse presented by Roth Living.

The 2025 Home & Garden Colorado Showhouse presented by Roth Living is a testament to

luxurious living that transcends trends. Designed to take full advantage of a corner lot in Denver's Washington Park neighborhood, this 5,450-square-foot residence balances timeless elegance with contemporary sophistication.

"We wanted to do something a little more classic, but it's still modern at the same time," says architect Conor Robinson, principal of Evergreen-based Robinson Architecture and Design, who took on the challenge of designing a home that maximizes space and functionality. The result is a home that feels grounded in tradition and unmistakably of the moment. obinson's design makes the most of the lot by creating meaningful connections to outdoor spaces.

A generous patio with a fireplace extends the living area beyond the home's physical boundaries, capitalizing on Colorado's abundant sunshine and mild climate.

This consideration for how modern families live and entertain influenced many of the home's design decisions, from the attached garage that doesn't dominate the façade to the placement of the four upstairs bedrooms.

A SIMPLE PALETTE

What immediately strikes visitors approaching the property is its impeccable curb appeal. The limestone cladding provides an enduring foundation, while contrasting dark siding adds contemporary visual interest. "The materials we used—the limestone cladding are timeless and elegant," Robinson says. "We kept the palette pretty simple."

Robinson's restraint with materials allows the home's architectural lines to take center stage. The design takes full advantage of southern exposure for natural illumination throughout the day. Floor-to-ceiling windows invite natural light to pour into the interior spaces, creating a seamless dialogue between indoors and out.

Pass through the impressive 4-foot by 10-foot entry door, and the home reveals its true character. The main level showcases custom stained oak ceiling detail that draw the eye upward. Custom wood and metal dividers between the dining room and entry hall create definition without sacrificing the open-concept feel that contemporary living demands. In the family room, a show-stopping fireplace combines quartz with soft wood elements—a perfect example of the Showhouse team's approach to creating subtle contrast throughout the home.

WARMTH AND TEXTURE

As the lead interior designer for the Showhouse, Kelly Flynn, principal designer and owner of Denver-based Studio Shelter, has orchestrated a visual experience that feels both cohesive and full of delightful surprises. "Our vision for this house is one of warmth and honoring the unique architecture," Flynn says. "We aimed to create a home that is both beautiful and functional, reflecting the charm and character of the Wash Park area."

Flynn says her team's goal was "to get away from the stark, modern feel and have a little bit more warmth and texture—so instead of it being black, white, wood, we used warm woods and maybe a countertop with some detail, a hue of a steely blue."

Every space has its own distinct personality while maintaining a harmonious relationship with the whole. The office, color-drenched in a rich hue with wallpaper extending to the ceiling, is an immersive environment that makes a bold statement. Throughout the home, carefully selected light fixtures serve as both functional elements and sculptural art pieces.

"Having bold lighting choices was really important to us," Flynn says. This attention to lighting design transforms spaces throughout the day and into evening, creating different moods as natural light shifts.

Perhaps most surprising is the basement level, where carefully considered material selections and thoughtful space planning elevate this traditionally overlooked area into a highlight of the home tour. "I don't think I've ever walked into a basement and said, 'wow!' until the painters pulled all of the plastic off of everything on this one," says builder Bill Lyons, founder of Greenwood Village-based Devex Properties. "And we didn't even have light fixtures in yet."

BUILT ON TRUST

Lyons, whose team built the residence in just eight months, emphasizes that the home's success stems from extraordinary teamwork. "The amount of coordination and cooperation required by all of the subcontractors involved and the amount of detail in this house—it shows a commitment," he says.

What makes this Showhouse particularly special, Lyons says, is the depth of relationships that made it possible. "The loyalty that Devex has to their subcontractors and how that's reciprocated—that's not very common. I think that tells a lot about who we are as a company, that we walk through fire for people. And they walk through fire for us."

The 2025 Home & Garden Colorado Showhouse presented by Roth Living is proof that when exceptional design meets meaningful purpose, the result is truly extraordinary. "All the designers included in this Showhouse have embraced innovation in their designs, incorporating the latest trends," Flynn says. "We feel that the design of the entire home will exude the modern, cutting-edge, and forward-thinking feel while honoring traditional design elements."

How did you make sure your space is functional but beautiful?

The layout took cue from the geometry of the space while keeping in mind how best to showcase its architectural features. This, in turn, guided furnishing selections with the objective to fill but not overwhelm the space. Harmonizing shapes, colors, materials, and textures in addition to balancing variety and interest always involves willingness to explore, observe, and rely on visual intuition. Identifying where to edit is critical to the process of making an enduring statement.

What in your space reflects your "signature?"

A concept called chiaroscuro kept surfacing in the art history classes I took in college, and I've been fascinated and inspired by this idea of using contrasting light and dark to create a sense of depth and drama. On an intuitive level, its application has permeated my design approach. Dialed up or down as required, it influences my choices for color, shades, reflective values, lighting among other things.

Why did you select this space to design?

What "trends" are you seeing that you especially love right now?

What's a key element that makes your space unique?

The balance of materials, contrast, and mixed metal finishes have been highly curated. The incorporation of details throughout a home is vital for achieving cohesion. These details, though often subtle, contribute to the overall sense of unity and completeness. Elements such as trim work, moldings, and custom cabinetry can tie together different areas of the home, creating a seamless transition from one space to another. Additionally, cohesive color palettes and repeating patterns can reinforce the sense of harmony and balance.

What "trends" are you seeing that you especially love right now?

Trends we are loving for the kitchen: matte finishes and earthy tones, evoking a sense of calm and sophistication; coordinating different backsplash and countertop materials as well as paint and wood finishes on cabinets.

What was the inspiration behind your furniture selection and placement?

We touched base with current design trends and elements in the interior and exterior architecture to further enhance cohesion. For example, the nook table has the tambour detail at the base touching back to the elements found in various locations and sizes throughout the home.

Any design tricks of the trade you can share (that you used in this space)?

We included a built-in bench for the nook, ensuring space for a family to enjoy meals since the space was limited. Using different colors/wood and metal tones helps curate the home to feel bespoke.

defy the norm, and make design unforgettable.

Why did you select this space to design?

I was immediately drawn to this space because of its incredible windows and prime location—it's visible both from the sidewalk and as soon as you enter, making it the perfect opportunity to create a lasting impression. While the overall home embraced a lighter, brighter aesthetic, I saw this as a chance to introduce contrast and depth with a moody, more masculine design. It felt like the ideal space to push boundaries and create something unexpected.

Any design tricks of the trade you can share (that you used in this space)?

A design trick I swear by is always adding drapery—it softens a space, introduces color, pattern, and texture, and makes windows feel more grand. That said, knowing when not to add drapery is just as important. My go-to method for assessing a window's ability to host drapery properly is ensuring at least 18 inches of wall space on either side, allowing the panels to hang fully without covering more than one inch of glass. I also check for at least four- to six- inches between the top of the window and the ceiling for the rod. In this space, the windows extend fully to the ceiling with minimal side wall space, so using my own rule, I chose to forgo drapery altogether. This lets the windows shine as a focal point rather than forcing drapery that would feel cramped or disproportionate.



What's a key element that makes your space unique?

My favorite design strategy for a powder room or a pass-through space like the adjoining hallway is to incorporate a wow factor that grabs attention and invites people in. In this space, the tile wall at the vanity serves as an instant focal point—even from outside the bathroom. Once inside, the drama unfolds with statement wallpaper and large-scale artwork, creating yet another unexpected and captivating moment. These thoughtful design choices spark curiosity, inviting guests to step in and take a closer look. And when they leave, they'll remember your powder bath as a beautifully designed space with personality.





Any design tricks of the trade you can share (that you used in this space)?

The ceiling is often an overlooked design opportunity, especially in a powder room. Think of it as a fifth wall—a perfect place to introduce color or visual interest. In this room, we selected a paint color that complements the tones in the wallpaper, enhancing the overall design.

One of the most common design mistakes I see homeowners make is misjudging scale and proportion, often resulting in art and accessories that are too small. To create a bold impact, I like to push boundaries by incorporating oversized artwork that elevates the entire room.

The powder room walls are painted with Sherwin Williams' Acacia Haze. Paintings from Abend Gallery by Alexandra Manukyan are a focal point.



What's a key element that makes your space unique?

Very obviously, the wallpaper and the bed. These help to create a balance between the lines of the fireplace on the opposite wall, and then adding a large, mostly geometric art piece over the bed to once again create a balance between the right and left side of the room. Then I filled in with finer art, accessories, chairs, and plants to help balance form and function in the space.

Any design tricks of the trade you can share (that you used in this space)?

I added the two side beams on the bed wall. The picture framed that wall, making it a second focal point. Putting wallpaper on the wall helped lend weight without making it heavy, kind of a counterbalance to the other wall with the fireplace. That already has the fireplace with the wood running all the way up, which becomes a natural focal point. I also use the trick of adding different textures and sheen levels of items to create a softer look. If you want to be more formal, you match more things together and have everything really tightly coordinated. As you do things more casually, you try to do complementary but mixed sheen levels and finishes to help bring the formality down.

What should homeowners keep in mind when designing their closet? Think about how you'd like to divide the space—either by person, if more than one person is sharing it, or by clothing category. In a closet intended for two users, start by identifying who has more inventory. Typically, the layout will naturally lend itself to one side being bigger. In this particular space, the layout resulted in two distinct rectangles—one large, one small—each designated for one of the two users. For single-user closets, consider separating areas by clothing type with zones for professional or business-casual wear and another for athleisure or workout clothes.

How did you balance functionality and beauty?

I imagined the homeowner facing the prettiest part of the space—the drawers with leather fronts and leather tops, with their wardrobes flanking either side. They'd have easy drawer access, with everything they need to get ready in arm's reach.

In both rooms, the bed wall serves as an anchor point, with the bedroom's other furnishings positioned to maximize functionality while maintaining clear pathways through the space.






am successful in creating a space that feels as if it has a connection to the site (Wash Park and Colorado) and creates the illusion of being a room with a view vis a vis the mural.

How did you make sure your space is functional but beautiful?

I chose to limit the amount of furniture in the room and to not put in a sectional. The placement of furniture allows for circulation and flow. One can entertain in this room; it sits ten people, but it doesn't feel crowded. The placement of the furniture allows for the mural to be viewed, and the panoramic adds interest and lure.

How do you go about selecting accessories?



How did you make sure your space is functional but beautiful?

The game room is adaptable, designed to entertain younger crowds while also accommodating adult gatherings in the evening. I focused on selecting pieces that not only enhance the aesthetic but also serve practical purposes. The layout was thoughtfully planned to allow for easy movement and use, ensuring each room is functional.

How did you incorporate the builder's aesthetic in to your space? The builders thoughtfully incor-

porated organic tones and modern forms, creating an ambiance that feels both warm and serene. A particular emphasis was placed on blending brass and black accents, adding a touch of sophistication and contrast to the space. 
